



TURTLE COVE & BARNUM'S WALL

Dive Site:

- The reef extends out to a plateau from and around Ngercheu Island
- > On top of the reef at Turtle Cove is a mini blue hole that forms a large cavern
- Numerous small caves, arches, and ledges
- > Turtle Cove is a vertical reef wall
- Currents can be strong at the Corner
- At Barnum's wall the reef moderately slopes down and then changes its formation to a rough sandy run off. Before the reef reaches the corner it changes to a sheer wall

Marine Life:

- Schools of Big Eye Jacks, striped & Black snappers, Goatfish, Pyramid Butterfly fish, Hawkfish, Square spot Anthias, Moorish Idols, Titan Triggers, Anemones, a variety of Angel fish and Yellowtail Fusiliers
- Different species of Nudibranchs
- Gray Reef sharks & White Tips patrol the reef top
- Turtles, large Groupers, Sweetlips
- White Tip Reef Sharks & Leopard Sharks like to rest in the sandy run-off at the mouth of the blue Hole exit
- Gorgonian fans, Crinoids, Soft & Leather coral
