



BIG DROP-OFF & NGEMELIS WALL

Dive Sites:

- Sheer vertical wall, running along the whole length of Ngemelis Island, in some places only a few feet away from the island
- The edge of the reef drops straight down to 900 feet
- One of Jacques Cousteau's favorite wall dives
- Close to the mooring buoy, a large chain connected to a 6 foot steel sphere can be seen. This chain and ball was used during WWII to prevent the Japanese from entering the waterway leading to German Channel

Marine Life:

- Gorgeous Soft corals, Leather Corals & Fans
- Schools of Pyramid Butterfly fish & Square Spot Anthias forage for Plankton just off the wall
- Moorish Idols, Sergeant Major's, Yellowtail Fusiliers & a variety of Angel fish are found along the edge of the reef
- Gray Reef, White Tip, and solitary Leopard sharks patrolling back and forth along the drop off
- White Tip Sharks, Nurse sharks & Leopard sharks can be seen sleeping on the sandy bottom
- The very well camouflaged Leaf fish, Stonefish & Lionfish
- Green & Hawksbill Turtles
- Anemones & all many colorful reef fish on the reef top
