



BLUE CORNER

Dive Site:

- The corner is a flat plateau, running for a couple of hundred yards out to sea before dropping off abruptly
- Consistently active with big and little fish action due to strong tidal currents
- Small hills, sand tunnels and gorges cut into the reef
- Depending on the direction of the current, the pelagic fish will switch from one side of the corner to the other

Marine Life:

- Gray Reef sharks & White Tip Reef sharks, Blue Fin & Big eye Trevally, large schools of Jacks & Snapper, Hawksbill & Green Turtles, Groupers, schools of Barracuda, a variety of small tropical fish, Napoleon Wrasse, Bump-head Parrotfish, Moray Eels, Mackerel, Wahoo & on occasion spotted Eagle Rays
- The critter list is almost endless, Leafy Scorpion fish, Nudibranchs, Lion fish, Anemone fish
- Bigger Pelagics are occasionally seen at the deeper reaches of Blue Corner. Hammerheads, Bull sharks, Tiger & Whale sharks, Marlin, Sailfish, Whales, Mantas, schooling Yellowfin and Dog tooth Tuna.
